
Directions to Papagallos Restaurant, Swanzey, NH



Papagallos Restaurant is located on the west side of Rt. 12 at the Keene-Swanzey town line.

From the north: In Keene take Rt. 12 South. Continue south on Rt. 12 past the intersection with Rt. 32. Papagallos will be on the right immediately upon crossing the Swanzey town line.

From the south: Take Rt. 12 north. Continue beyond the Cheshire Fairgrounds approximately two miles. Papagallos will be on your left.

Guest Speakers: Judy Silva and Cordell Johnston, New Hampshire Municipal Association

Judy Silva serves as Executive Director of the New Hampshire Municipal Association (NHMA), a nonprofit, nonpartisan membership organization of NH cities and towns established in 1941. She started with NHMA in 1992, and in her current position is responsible for the oversight of all activities and services provided by the association, including legal advisory services for member municipal officials, advocacy on municipal interests before the state legislature and state agencies, and educational programs and publications for municipal officials. Before joining NHMA, Judy was a court-appointed criminal defense attorney with the NH Public Defender's Office and practiced briefly in the private sector. Judy received her B.S. from UNH and her J.D. from Franklin Pierce Law Center (now UNH School of Law).

Cordell Johnston is an attorney and lobbyist for the NHMA where he represents the interests of New Hampshire's towns and cities. Before joining NHMA in 2004, he practiced law with Orr & Reno, a Concord law firm, for 19 years. He is a former selectman and planning board member for the Town of Henniker. He is a frequent lecturer and the author of many articles on municipal law issues, especially planning and zoning matters and the Right to Know law. He graduated from Princeton University in 1981 and from Boston University School of Law in 2004.
