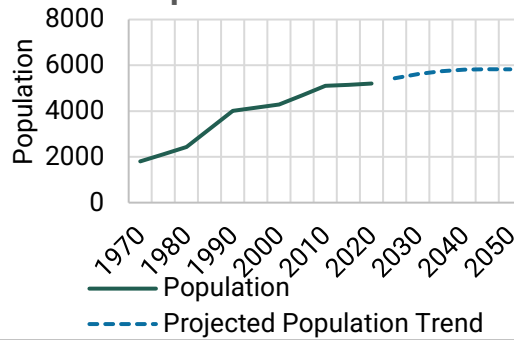

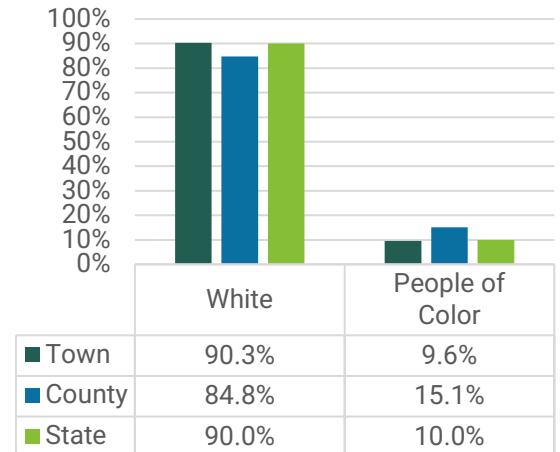

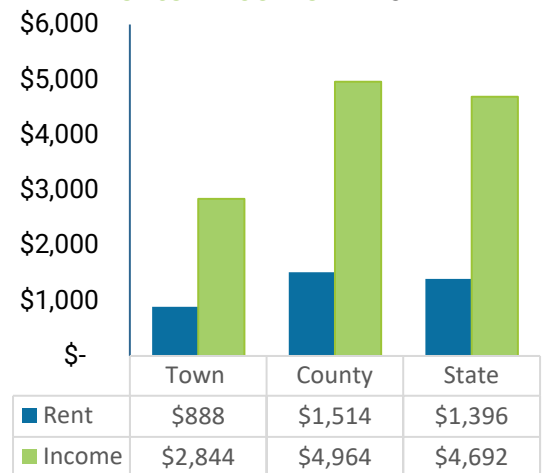

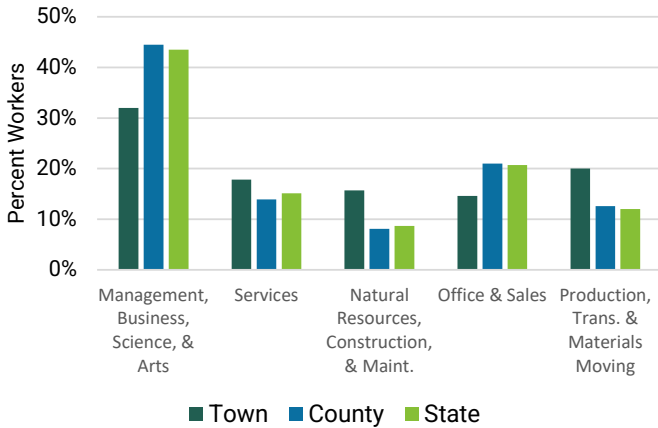

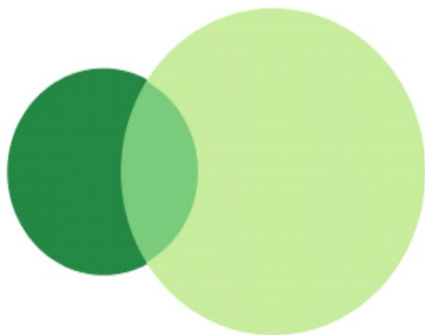
Where do Residents Work?

All Workers

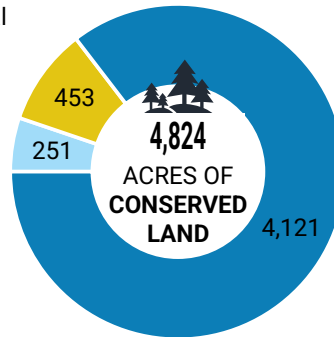

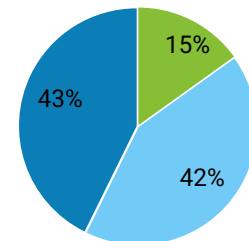
